



- Sub:- Streamlining of PMS System - Admissions in all Corporate colleges 2012-13 - Registration of students selected by the District Selection Committee - Further Instructions – Issued
- Ref:- 1. GO.Ms.No.235, SW (Edn.2) Dept., dated 28-03-2011.
2. Govt. Memo No.6446/SW.Edn.2/2011, dated:21-06-2011.
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In the reference I* cited orders have been issued by the Government, to implement the scheme of providing access to quality education to meritorious poor students belonging to the SC/ST/BC/MW communities who have secured more than 400 marks in the SSC examination in reputed colleges in the private sector at the Intermediate level, to enable them to compete in competitive examinations such as IIT-JEE/AIEEE/EAMCET, to secure seats in premier medical and engineering institutions. Under the scheme reputed private colleges have been identified and students selected from all the 22 Rural Districts through a District Selection Committee. Selected students are then sent to the reputed colleges as opted by students. The total fee payable is Rs. 38,000 per student, of which Rs. 35,000 is towards tuition fee and Rs.3000 is towards pocket expenses of the student.

2. In the reference 2nd cited Instructions have also been issued for admissions to reputed colleges (Corporate Colleges). Vide the said instructions; the selections to these colleges have to be finalized by the District Selection Committee after giving wide publicity. As the academic year is about to begin and with a view to ensure that the benefit of the scheme-fully accrues, to students, all District Social Welfare Officers should ensure that the selection and admission process must complete by 30-06-2011.
3. Keeping in view of the guidelines issued in the references 1st and 2nd cited, admissions shall be provided each year for 5500 meritorious rural students who have secured 400 marks and above at the SSC examination, from the SC /ST/BC & MW communities, in reputed Junior Colleges in private sector. Students eligible under this scheme shall have to secure a minimum of 400 marks in SSC examinations and will be selected strictly in order of Merit by the District Selection Committee (DSC) at the district level.
4. In view of the introduction of the grading system by the SSC Board., it is proposed to revise the guidelines for selection of students this year (2012-13).
5. The Board of Secondary Education have since announced the results of SSC Exams held in March, 2012 duly following the “Absolute Grading System”. Hence, the individual wise marks in SSC examination may not be available in their marks memo. Hence, the following revised guidelines are issued for selection of Meritorious students by the District Selection Committee for admission into reputed Junior Colleges during the year 2012-2013.
6. The following Grades were indicated in the “Absolute Grading System” in the SSC Public Examinations held in March, 2012.

7. The above grading system is done based on the marks obtained by the student in each subject i.e.. English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Hindi & Telugu the highest grade is A1 followed by A2 and the last grade is D2 as shown in the table given below.

8. The District Selection Committee shall conduct the overall selection process based on the previous orders / Instructions issued in reference 1st and 2nd cited and in-addition to adopt the guidelines given as under in view of the grading system as under:

1. Candidate who gets a higher grade point average will be given preference in allotment of their choice of Junior College.
2. Where Two Students get the same grade point average then the aggregate of the marks scored in Mathematics and General Science (grade point of Maths + Science divided by 2) should be taken into account. Those getting higher aggregate will get preference of choice.
3. If the average grade point and aggregate score in Mathematics and Science is same for two or more candidates then preference will be given to older candidates as per date of birth. The oldest student will be preferred among the applicants.
4. If the date of birth is also found to be same then preference will be given to such candidates whose first name is higher in the alphabetic order.
5. Candidates scoring up to B2 grade only shall be considered for admission under the Corporate College Scheme.
6. If adequate number of girls are not available the vacant seats of girls shall be permitted to be filled by boys by following the same selection procedure only after the respective selection for boys and girls, are completed in the first instance. Such inter change shall be effected after completion of the first round of counseling.
7. Where a student of the last year has 'applied with the marks, applies under the scheme, this year then the marks shall be first converted to grade points & processed as per the guidelines (1 - 6 above).
8. Where a student is sponsored under the hostel category, such students shall have been in a Welfare Hostel at least for a period of three years, ending with the year of qualification from SSC. In all such cases, the Hostel Warden shall issue a Certificate for such students which shall be verified by the District Welfare Officer.

7. The District Welfare Officers are requested to ensure that the selected students report to the respective colleges by 07-07-2012. These instructions shall be scrupulously followed and any deviation of these instructions will be viewed seriously.
